Shin Morikita's long-awaited first large-scale solo exhibition Will the secrets of the museum's Flying Man and Hunter's finally be revealed?!

Shin Morikita is the creator of *Flying Man and Hunter*, an artwork in the Towada Art Center permanent collection. The piece's two sculptures reside outside between the museum's exhibition spaces and can be found only by looking up to the sky. Are they floating there? Or is one trying to catch the other as he tries to fly away? Their humorous figures beg us to consider their relationship and the *ma*, or the spaces in between.

Morikita will carefully examine a space and, with impeccable balance, transform it with simple paintings and sculptures that highlight the characteristics of their materials. Motifs such as people, houses, and trees are often seen in his work, and the relationships between environment and art, architecture and art, people and art, and even between art and art all hang somewhere in the middle, wrapped in poetic humor.

Ever Present Figures will be Morikita's first solo exhibition at a museum and will present, for the first time, the portfolio of artwork he has produced since the turn of the millennium. In this exhibition, Morikita tells all-new stories while sharing the latest in a series of works that can be traced back to Flying Man and Hunter. The title—Ever Present Figures—has layers of interpretation left to be uncovered while enjoying and experiencing the charm of the exhibition.

In these uncertain and stifling times, as relationships grow ever more complex and people and things are reduced to mere numbers, we hope that you will join us at the Towada Art Center to pause for a moment and see yourself and your surroundings in a new light.



Shin Morikita

Born in Aichi Prefecture in 1969. Shin Morikita graduated from Aichi University of Arts, Department of Sculpture, and currently lives and works in Tajimi City in Gifu Prefecture. A prominent painter and sculptor, he produces art around motifs like people and houses. His work has been shown at exhibitions around the world, including 2009 exhibition *Kami. Silence – Action: Japanese Contemporary Art on Paper* (Staatliche Kunstsammlungen Dresden, Dresden, Germany), *Aichi Triennale 2016 - Homo Faber: A Rainbow Caravan* (Aichi Arts Center, Nagoya, and other sites in Aichi, Japan), and most recently *so alone* (Kenji Taki Gallery, Tokyo, Japan, 2017). His humorous pair of sculptures, *Flying Man and Hunter*, is part of the Towada Art Center permanent collection.

Shin Morikita installed a pair of sculptures, composed of two human body forms within a slit-like triangular outdoor space—like some kind of urban canyon—at the Towada Art Center. One of the pair's hands and feet are thrust out in between the buildings, as though comically flying in the sky. The other is watching humorously from a bridge, as if to capture, or to mock, the first.
